Living Voices blends dynamic solo performance with archival film and historical storytelling. **Winning Her Wings: Home Front/War Front** transforms history into a deeply

personal and unforgettable experience. This powerful production follows the groundbreaking Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASPs) of World War II—including Jewish, Chinese American, and other

pioneering women—who navigated racism, sexism, and patriotism as they helped shape the war effort from the skies. As Artistic Director and performer with Living Voices, Rachael McClinton has performed nationally in productions ranging from Musicals to Shakespeare. The creation of Living Voices was inspired by the mission to bring life to history through the powerful combination of solo theater and archival film. "Winning Her Wings" has been performed at the Museum of Flight, NW Museum of Arts & Culture. Pearl Theatre in Bonner's Ferry, Colorado College, Museum of History & Industry, Washington State Historical Museum, and in educational settings nationally.
